workforce needed for productivity in business and industry and for securing

America's leadership in the international marketplace; and

WHEREAS: Career and technical education offers individuals lifelong opportunities to learn new

skills, leading to expanded career choices; and

WHEREAS: Career and technical education gives high school students practical experience in basic

skills such as reading, writing, and mathematics, thereby improving the quality of their education and providing leadership opportunities in their communities and fields of

interest; and

WHEREAS: The ever-increasing cooperative efforts between career and technical educators and

members of the business and industrial communities stimulate local and national economic vitality by preparing graduates for career fields forecasted to experience the

most growth in the next decade.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM PAWLENTY, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of February 2010 to be:

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION MONTH

in the State of Minnesota and urge all citizens to become familiar with the services and benefits offered by career and technical education programs in their communities, and to enhance their work skills and productivity by participating in these programs.
